"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man (or woman) of God may be complete, equipped for every good work." (2 Timothy 3:16-17)

The "all Scripture" in this verse may have included the earliest writings of the New Testament, but primarily it refers to the writings of the Old Testament. The 66 books of the Bible, those that have been canonized, are the ones the church has accepted over the centuries as "God breathed." As you know, the Reformation slogan, 'Sola Scriptura' means that Scripture is the only true norm according to which all teachers and teachings are to be judged and evaluated. Scripture alone is the sole source of truth and doctrine and our guiding light to live by.

With this in mind we learn from Luther's writings that he often commends Holy Scripture as the most important thing to be taught, especially to children, because this was the only way they could be equipped to be good citizens in society and fruitful Christians in the home and Church. They must receive the knowledge and grace that comes from Holy Writ. They must receive Christ and His light from the books of the Bible.

Here is an example of this approach to discipleship that Luther commended: "Above all, in schools *of all kinds* the chief and most common lesson should be the Scriptures...for where the Holy Scriptures are not the rule, I advise no one to send his child. Everything must perish where God's Word is not studied unceasingly; and so we see what manner of men there are now in the universities (does this sound familiar?). The soul can do without everything except the Word of God. Without this, it suffers need. But when it has the Word of God, it needs nothing more, but has in the Word enough—food, joy, peace, light, art, righteousness, truth, freedom and every good thing in abundance." (This is a Luther quote from Painter's book *Luther on Education*.)

When it came to establishing two popular (really public) schools in Mansfeld, Germany, as commissioned by the local magistrate, Luther designed a curriculum in which Scripture was taught to the children for one hour *every* day. Since the vast majority of schools for children (mostly boys) in the middle ages were operated by the Roman Catholic Church and were used in preparing young men for their service as priests and young women for their service as nuns, any other newly established school was considered a "popular" school; it was open to everyone, boys and girls, Catholics or not. The two schools Luther established in Mansfeld were not "parochial" in our use of the word, by this I mean, schools affiliated with a denomination.

It was Luther who established a curriculum in these two schools that is remarkably consistent with what was used in the 19th & 20th centuries in the public schools of this country, i.e., a traditional curriculum. For example, Luther included music and what we would call "gym class" in his curriculum. He advocated for the natural sciences. In this regard, he wanted children to get out of the classroom and to observe and experience nature first hand. He promoted education for both girls and boys.

As far as pedagogy is concerned, he insisted on teaching methods that employed simplicity and repetition. He advocated for the Socratic method of instruction, namely the use of questions and answers. (We see this in his writing of the Small Catechism.) He stressed learning that was enjoyable for the children and adaptive to their inquisitive nature; no more using a rod or stick to discipline them in order to coerce learning. And there was to be no more strict indoctrination. Luther believed that if the Scriptures were properly taught, especially in the vernacular of the German language, the Holy Spirit would reveal the truth of the Gospel to them.

I bring these aspects of Lutheran education to mind for the purpose of sharpening our focus as Lutheran Christians today and as a congregation that operates a parochial school. I think we would all agree that the future of our congregation and thousands of others rests on how well we teach the faith to the next generation(s). Christian leaders have been and will be equipped for every good work only by way of the Holy Scriptures and the Spirit that comes to us by this means. As the younger generations spend less and less time in God's Word, reading, marking, learning, and inwardly digesting it, less and less time being catechized, less time being guided by the Holy Spirit, the church will suffer. Yes, there will be a dearth of faithful leaders. Or worse yet, the leaders we will have in the church, in homes, and in society will be promoting and exemplifying what is contrary to God's will. They will not know Christ as He has revealed himself. And no doubt the church will look much different; it already does look much different because of the ignorance of God's Word that exists. May we all seek to be learners of God's Word for life, yes, learning for life in Christ! Hey, where have I heard that before? ~ Pastor Johnson
